What is the study about?

We are looking at current practices in relation to working with culturally and linguistically diverse (CALD) communities across Ireland. There is a lack of data about the ways in which General Practice Nurses support these individuals, and the ways in which General Practice Nurses are supported to do this, for example through cultural competence training. What will you have to do?
